PREAMBLE:

In the Government Order read at(1) above, the seat sharing and fee structure for admission to MBA, MCA, M.E. and M.Tech courses in Karnataka for the academic year 2012-13 has been published.

In the letter read at (2) above, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has informed that Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) is the test for admission in MBA programmes in AICTE approved institutions and University Departments of all the States for 2013-14.

In the letter read at (3) above, Visveshwaraya Technological University, Belgaum has sought for the procedure to be followed for admission to MBA programme in the light of the policy decision of AICTE for conducting a national level Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) for admission MBA programmes for 2013-14.

In the Notifications read at Sl.Nos.(4) (6) and (7) above, AICTE has issued advertisements in the newspapers announcing the schedule for conducting CMAT/Additional CMAT for admission for academic year 2013-14 and better of two scores will be used for admission to MBA programme.

In the letters/fax message read at (5) above, Government has informed to all the concerned through Registrars of Universities in Karnataka for the information of MBA aspirants that admissions to MBA course will be based on CMAT ranking.

The Karnataka Private Post Graduate Colleges' Association has challenged the conduction of CMAT before the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka in W.P.Nos.20572-592/2013 and sought permission to conduct KMAT for the management quota admissions. In its interim order at Sl.No.(8) above, the Hon'ble High Court has granted permission to the petitioner to conduct KMAT through their Association for the purpose of grant of admissions into Petitioner-Institutions as prayed for.

It has been decided to follow CMAT for admissions to MBA course under Government quota of 50% seats to be filled through Karnataka Examinations Authority for the year 2013-14 on merit basis by following reservation policy pending amendment to the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Master of Business Administration and Master of Computer Application Courses Rules, 2005, and the balance 50% of seats to be filled by the Private Managements by conducting KMAT for admission to MBA course as per the interim orders of the Hon'ble High Court.

Admissions to MCA course for 2013-14 will be as per the Notification read at (10) above. 50% of the total intake will be filled by KEA based on PG CET by following reservation policy. Further, it has been decided to consider 20% of sanctioned intake for admission to second year MCA course by the students who have completed Bachelor's Degree of minimum 3 years duration in BCA, BSc.(IT/Computer Science) with Mathematics as a course at 10+2 level or at Graduate level as per AICTE norms read at (12) above. The students should have obtained at least 50% (45% in case of SC/ST category) at the qualifying examination for lateral entry admissions.

The seat allotments to M.E. and M.Tech courses will be made as per the provisions of the Notifications read at (11) above on merit basis by following reservation policy.

Further, it has been decided that the seat sharing and fee structure for the above PG courses will remain as of the last year.

Hence, the order.

GOVERNMENT ORDER NO.ED 177 TEC 2012, DATED 2nd August 2013.

Government are pleased to order that the seat sharing and fee structure for admission to MBA, MCA, M.E. and M.Tech courses in Karnataka for the academic year 2013-14 will be as follows:

1. Category-A:

- (a) 50% of the total intake in MBA in all private unaided institutions shall be filled through online/centralised counseling conducted by Karnataka Examinations Authority (KEA) for 2013-14 on the basis of the ranking obtained in the Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) conducted by AICTE. The balance 50% of seats will be filled by the Private managements on the basis of KMAT conducted by the Karnataka Private Post Graduate Colleges' Association on the basis of merit and subject to academic eligibility as prescribed by the competent authorities or on the basis of CMAT rankings.
- (b) 50% of the total intake in MCA in all private unaided institutions shall be filled on the basis of merit in the PG CET through centralized/online counseling by the Karnataka Examination Authority by following reservation policy.


- (c) 20% of sanctioned intake for admission to second year MCA course shall be filled by the students who have completed Bachelor's Degree of minimum 3 years duration in BCA, BSc.(IT/Computer Science) with Mathematics as a course at 10+2 level or at Graduate level. The students should have obtained at least 50% (45% in case of SC/ST category) at the qualifying examination for lateral entry admissions.
- (d) The students who seek admissions for the above courses shall be The tuition fee payable will be Rs.50,000/- p.a. + University fees for the above courses.

2. Category-B:

- a) 80% of the total intake in ME and M.Tech courses in all private unaided institutions and unaided courses in private aided institutions shall be filled on the basis of merit secured in GATE or PG CET (in the PG CET examination) through centralized counseling by the Karnataka Examination Authority as per the provisions of the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Master of Engineering (M.E. and Master of Technology (M.Tech) Courses Rules, 2005. The tuition fee payable will be Rs.60,000/- p.a. + University fees.
- b) 20% of the total intake in ME and M.Tech courses in all private unaided institutions and unaided courses private aided institutions shall be filled on the basis of merit secured in GATE or PG CET or rank list prepared after conducting common Entrance Test by Association of Private Educational Institutions in accordance with merit list subject to eligibility as prescribed by the competent authorities/Universities. The institution concerned can admit students who have taken any of these tests. The tuition fee payable will be Rs.60,000/- p.a. + University fees.
3. The Government of Karnataka has not mandated a centralized counseling process for the private/unaided institutions for the current academic year. The institutions concerned shall ensure that admissions of management quota are made in a fair and transparent manner. The students should be guided properly by the Association about the procedures to be adopted by the colleges and also to decide the option specifically in selecting the tests like K-MAT/GATE/PGCET/MAT/CAT/JMET and XAT or Common Entrance Test conducted by Association of Private Educational Institutions. A monitoring committee shall be constituted by the Government which shall meet as often as required to ensure proper implementation of the norms prescribed in this order.

4. A Grievance Cell shall be setup by the Karnataka Private Post Graduate Colleges' Association in Bangalore to look into the grievances if any received from any candidate / institution. The Government may choose to intervene if the Association does not act in the bonafide interest of the students.
